We hope this newsletter finds you all well this holiday season. The FPA Board of Directors are already working hard to implement the following goals for 2024:



IMPORTANT LEGAL UPDATES

- 1. A new article authored by APA Attorney Vaughn with Past APA President Don Krapohl and Raymond Nelson was published in the APA Journal that suggests guidelines for preemployment polygraph testing to avoid violating the ADA/EEOC. We recommend everyone conducting these types of exams read the article carefully and perhaps share it with your agencies.
- 2. New case law came out in 2023 regarding a polygraph conducted in a criminal investigation. The court of appeals found that the examiner who conducted the exam did not have qualified immunity because the jury could find that he fabricated the polygraph evidence, and the examiner could be held liable if the jury determined he acted in bad faith due to the examiner not using best practices. The city he worked for could also be held liable for failure to train him properly, no quality control in place, and no SOP in place for conducting polygraphs.
